The courses were conducted as part of our staff wellness and education programmes. One of the primary benefits is that it will allow carers to communicate more effectively with Judith Cunniffe in our Care Facility.

Judith was born deaf and had to sign secretly with her childhood

sweetheart during an era where the use of sign language was frowned upon. That childhood sweetheart Farrell later became her husband and now visits the village every day to spend time with her.

Our Operational Support Manager Cheryl Silich says that "watching Farrell and Judith share their love through signing is wonderful".

The team is now keen to join in, at least on a basic level, and can now

communicate with Judith on a more personal level rather than through written notes on a whiteboard in her room.

Beryl 'Harri' Harrison of Deaf Aotearoa, who conducted the 'taster' course thought it was brilliant to see how invested our carers were in learning how to communicate with Judith and Farrell and commented "they're a fabulous crew with hearts the size of a small nation."

Your Donation Helps

As a Registered Charitable Company all of our profits are used to benefit the people who live here. We work hard to provide the best facilities and quality of life possible for the elderly residents of our Care Facility but there are always advancements we can make and more people we can help.

We plan to expand our Care Facility from 66 to 100 beds. We'd also like to rebuild the Paterson wing providing larger rooms with ensuites for greater privacy and comfort however it's a big ask and will cost around 8.5 million dollars.

To make these plans a reality we will need donations from our community. Whether it's a one-off gift or a regular contribution, making a donation is easy. Just pop into reception during work hours or call us for our account details. Every donation, no matter how big or small, generally entitles you to claim a third back against your tax (although if your contribution is sizeable then we suggest consulting your accountant to make sure you receive the maximum tax benefit).

Or you may like to make a gift after your passing by leaving a percentage or the residue of your estate to Kerikeri Retirement Village as a bequest. This can usually be done by making a simple amendment to your existing Will however we recommend discussing it with your family and your solicitor first.

If you're considering a bequest then you may like to talk to the Northland Community Foundation who is working with us to develop our bequests program. They have significant experience and expertise in this area and their qualified staff can provide the appropriate paperwork to structure a bequest.

Introducing the Northland Community Foundation



We are proud to have partnered with Northland Community Foundation, a Charitable Trust that exists to support other Charitable Trusts to raise and manage donations.

They have 1.5 full time staff and 10 appropriately qualified volunteers dedicated to raising awareness of the causes they support and their investments. Their team provides specialist skills and professional expertise that we would otherwise have to pay for and negates the administration and associated costs of us managing such a fund.

As an impartial body, they can also work with donors to structure how they would like their gifts to be made and dispersed for maximum benefit to the donor (and where relevant to their business or trust).

Their advice to donors is free as is the paperwork they provide to ensure that things are clearly documented and happen in accordance with the donor's wishes.

Another major benefit of working with the Northland Community Foundation is that while we have our own funds, we can receive a portion of the cumulative interest of their total investment portfolio (in much the same way a Kiwisaver or Life Policy works).

Together with Northland Community Foundation we are creating two funds. The first is an endowment fund where the money given accrues and the interest generated from that will be used for the 'nice to haves' that make life that extra bit more enjoyable. Things like a new bowls lawn, a new bbq or projector and other things on our residents' 'wish list'.

The second is a Capital Projects Fund and that money will go towards large projects such as the expansion and improvements of our Care Facility and a new Social Centre.

Donors will be given all the options so they can decide how they want their contribution to be used.

Northland Community Foundation is all about making the process of donating simple and informed.
