

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Theme Weeks





Podiatry Clinic available at Kerikeri Village



Anna Dawes

Anna Dawes of Kerikeri Podiatry is now running clinics at the Retirement Village.

Trained in the UK, Anna worked in Sussex as a National Health Service Podiatrist and then as a Podiatry Manager. Now a NZ Registered Podiatrist, Anna moved to Kerikeri in 2007 with her husband and two children and has been in private practice for over four years.

She is now running a Wednesday Podiatry Clinic for residents. This is a subsidised service and appointments can be booked at reception on 09 407 0070.

Anna also offers a fortnightly Tuesday clinic that is open to anyone and you can book a time by contacting Anna direct on 0210 267 1839.

Anna says it's very important for people with diabetes to have their feet checked every time they see the Practice Nurse as they can refer them for a free podiatry check if there is a clinical need. Podiatry funding is also available from WINZ, ACC, War Veterans and via the Northland Parkinson's Society.

Anna says many foot problems are caused by poor footwear. Replacing those old sloppy slippers with good, supportive footwear that can be worn indoors also reduces the risk of slips, trips and falls. No matter what state your feet are in she says "don't worry... I promise they will not be the worst I have ever seen!"
