It is with sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Esther Turner, a long-time supporter and generous benefactor of the Village.

Esther, who was 92, began volunteering here when she was in her late 60's. She was on the original Repair & Maintenance Committee when we built the first cottages. An enthusiastic fundraiser, she will be remembered by all for her wicked sense of humour. She loved animals and was inseparable from Ricky, her fox terrier-cross, who was also quite a character.

Towards the end of her life, Esther lived in our Care Facility for a year. Although she is gone, we still have her best legacy in the form of daughter, Dale Bell, who is a St Johns volunteer here and who has inherited all of her mother's caring qualities.



Here to help



Village Support is a home based support service for those who need a helping hand. Operating since 2012, the team now supports over 65 seniors in their own homes, providing assistance with things like meal preparation, laundry and general housework. Carers also provide transportation to medical appointments, assist with shopping and run an array of personal errands.

We provide well in excess of 300 hours support per month and much of that is funded through the District Health Board. If you or someone you know needs help, we can put you in touch with the relevant people who can assess your eligibility for funding.

Many of the people we help are private clients and some, while not necessarily elderly, just need short term help while they recover from an accident for illness.

Allan McLeod CELEBRATING 30 YEARS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE



Allan McLeod volunteered legal advice to the Kerikeri Village Trust since 1986.

Although he's officially retired, successful businessman and accomplished lawyer Allan McLeod has been volunteering legal advice to the Kerikeri Village Trust since 1986 when the first cottages were built. He's used his specialist knowledge to help with sale and purchase agreements, and to oversee the hundreds of employment and supply contracts required to ensure the smooth operation of such a large organisation.

Always passionate about championing the rights of the elderly and providing them with rewarding lifestyle choices, Allan joined the

Board of Trustees in 2004. Whatever the project, he's used his professional expertise and considerable influence within the community to get the right people on board to fulfil the vision.

He's applied that same enthusiasm to help drive a number of fundraising projects by using his contacts within other community organisations he contributes to. One memorable example is getting his fellow Lion's to assist with fundraising to purchase a hoist for the care facility – a very successful initiative that enabled the Village to raise \$10,000 within three months.

Allan has also won a lot of hearts because of his hands on approach. He's the first to offer to man the barbecue at residents' functions and he knows most of them on a first name basis.

Due to personal circumstances, Allan has recently resigned from the board leaving some big shoes to fill. He encourages other people to get involved and emphasises that you don't have to have a professional background to make a difference. He says age is a qualification not a barrier and he wants people to understand that "no matter how old you are, you still have something to contribute".

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
