1. QUIZ NIGHT

2. HOUSIE AFTERNOONS

We run a housie session every Monday afternoon in the Social Centre and this is open to anyone who wants to join in the fun.

cash. The last house of the day is a jackpot. Sessions run from 1pm until 2.30pm and cards cost \$2.50 each. All welcome.

3. TAI CHI

Our Diversional Therapist, Chrissy Taylor, is a trained Tai Chi Instructor and runs classes in the Social Centre every Monday and Friday at 11am.

Tai Chi promotes flexibility, balance and wellbeing and the public is welcome to join in. Classes cost \$8.50 per session or \$7.00 if you purchase a concession ticket.

4. IN-HOUSE NURSERY

Our gardeners propagate all their own plants.

We have a small sample of seedlings and plants available for purchase outside the main entrance.

If you're after something specific or you want a few plants, ask at reception and they'll arrange for a gardener to take you through the nursery.

5. MEETING ROOM

Tui Wing Opening

The extensive renovations and additional rooms recently completed at the Kerikeri Retirement Village were officially opened in October by Dr Alan Davis of the Northland District Health Board.

The changes, which included significant improvements to the dementia unit, kitchen and laundry areas, were done to meet increasing demand from the community for additional residential care and Meals On Wheels.

Dr Davis commented at the opening that "Kerikeri's approach was very much in the forefront of health change in providing a comprehensive range of facilities within one complex".

He congratulated the Kerikeri Village Trust for its commitment to older people in the community and their flexibility in providing changing care and service options as the community's needs changed.
